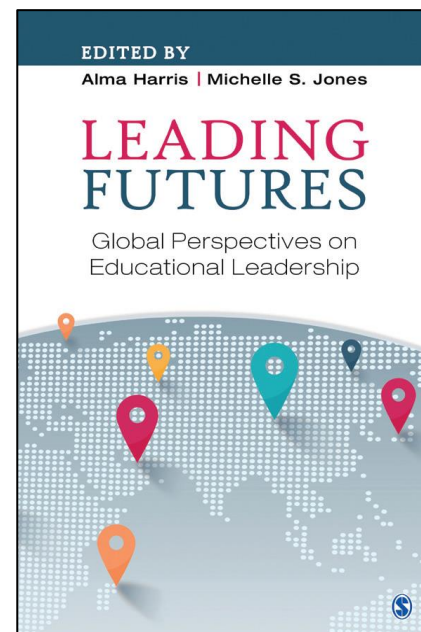

This book offers multiple perspectives on educational leadership from the viewpoint of scholars, policymakers and practitioners.
