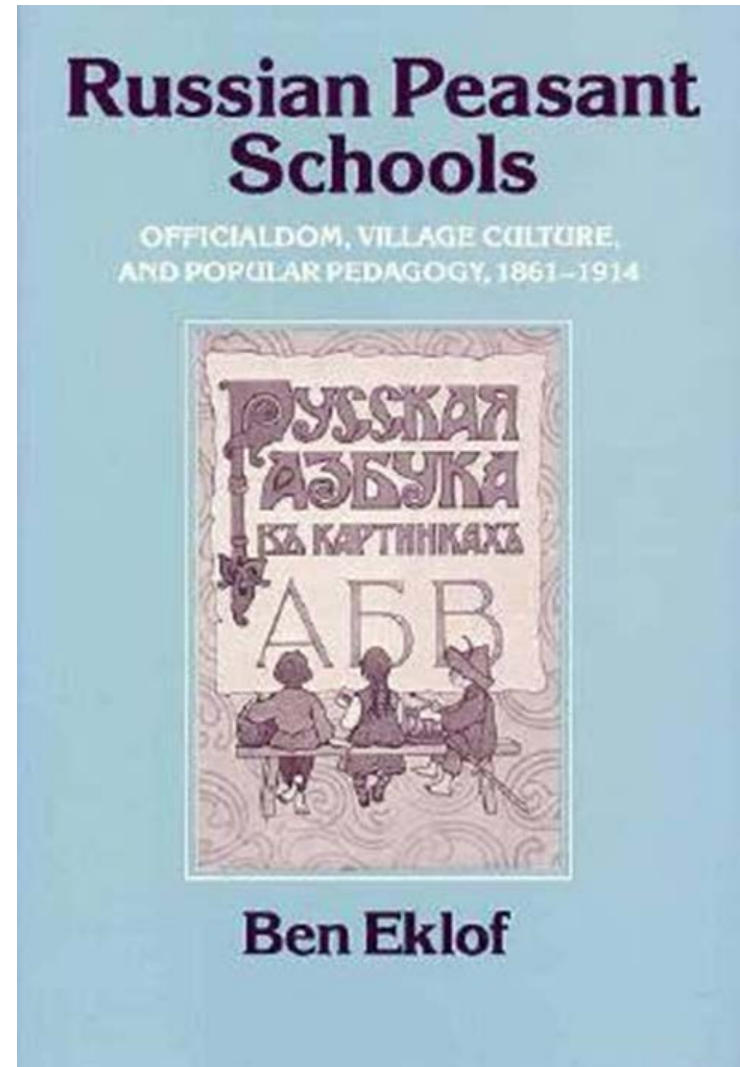

This fact about schools is often easy to lose sight of in an environment where conflicting claims abound about the relative weight of such features as teachers' pay, instructional methods, the quality of school and district leadership, the effect of externally defined standards, the impact of family socio-economic status and levels of student motivation, breadth and depth of curriculum, the quality of teachers' pre-service training, and the physical safety of those in schools...The problem is that all are important, and the definition of which may be more significant than another depends on local interactions among all these variables. 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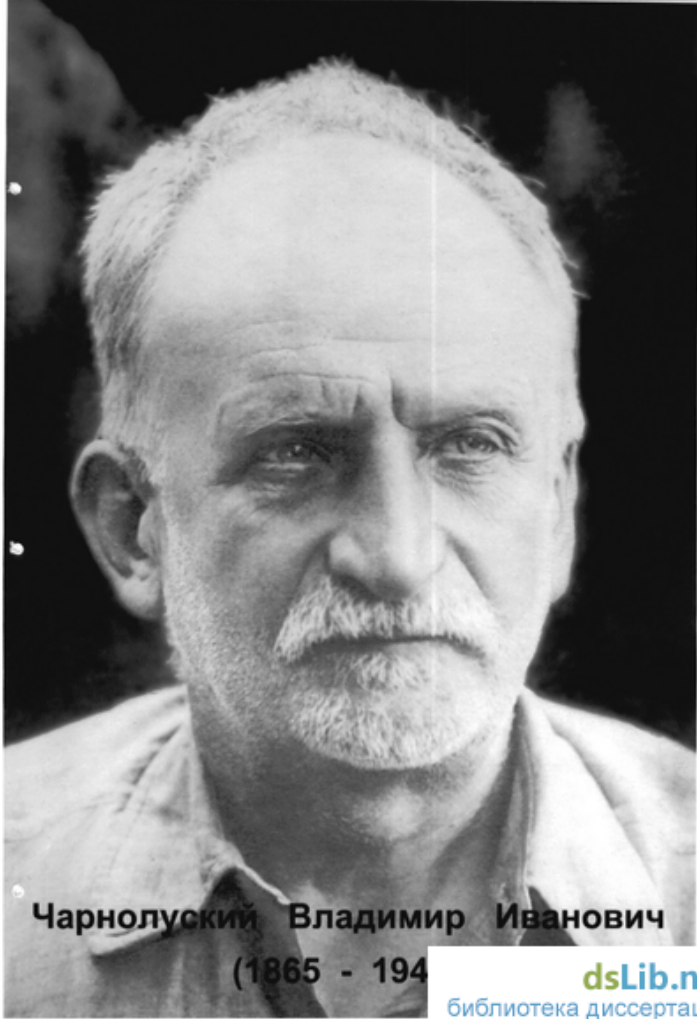
